They'll give you a mother-baby "couplet" to care for, and the mother needs the same assessments & charting as a med-surg patient, PLUS all the stuff that goes with OB. The baby needs an assessment, vitals, maybe feeding & changing (often the mother does this), and a hepatitis B vaccine.

Early neonatal care is of utmost importance [].One example of such care is the mother-newborn skin-to-skin contact immediately after birth in healthy term neonates [].Findings of studies over the last 25 years suggest that the first hour after birth is a critical time for bonding between mother and child, when both are ready for a coordinated reciprocal interaction [3-8].

### **The Mother-Newborn Skin-to-Skin Contact Questionnaire ...**

The outcome was assessed at 2 months after the start of the study. Our desired outcome was maternal healthy behaviors. Healthy behaviors included maternal behaviors in relation to nutrition, physical activity, cigarette smoking and alcohol consumption, breastfeeding, FP, personal and mental health, and ability to taking care of the newborn.

### **Comparison of Effects of Home Visits and Routine ...**

During the fall 2019 semester, Leon supervised 40 UTEP students participating in the maternal/newborn care clinical rotation experience at UMC.
